Thanks for your prayers and being a part of a Great Adventure!

Recently, we had one hour of worship and Praise with the Pastors and an hour of lesson. The miracle was there was just enough material for the whole time. The pastors said afterwards it was just what they needed to hear. It was on Christ the Healer. It was on renewing our minds, knowing the will of God, and acting on it.



A couple weeks ago, we went to a swimming pool and to have a Baptism. We were asked to speak to the one's already Baptized about their responsibility to the ones that were just baptized. We did not have any thing written for this, just relied on the Holy Spirit to tell them what He wants.

If you would have asked Larry and I years ago if we would ever be teachers we would have said no. But our amazing God is using us to carry out His great commission of disciplining His people.

Saturday we had another class with the pastors. Then we met Miky and his family (Street Water Ministry) for lunch and then went to his home where we prepared for feeding the homeless in the plaza. We prepared over 25 gallons of milk, picked up bread at a bakery, and arrived at the plaza by 4:30 where we helped feed over 300 of the homeless. Over 120 gallons of water were heated by a portable water heater for washing babies and washing hair. After washing, the babies were given clean clothes and the dirty clothes taken home for washing and to given out the next Saturday. Inflation on milk and bread is really creating a problem in being able to buy enough to feed all the homeless that come to the plaza. The price on milk and bread has tripled since the first of the year. We are so thankful to our Lord for all the money that was raised by BRC Church and the other Churches. There is such a need here.

Pastor Israel from the VME church also came to the plaza and he and Kay told the salvation (Orphan Lamb) story to many children. Many children raised their hands to except Jesus in their hearts. We need to pray for the disciplining for these children.



Sunday Kay taught the Parable of the Farmer and the seeds to the young adults. She did a wonderful job by using a pot, seeds, live plants, weeds and rocks. There were thirty present for this teaching and they all were very attentive and understood the teaching better because of the examples. Afterwards, they were presented with a necklace with a cross on it that was made of red-heart cedar from Blue Ridge area in AZ.

It is amazing how the building of the church has gone forward over the last year. They have completely dug out the basement that we were working on last year and put up new walls and floor. They have moved the worship area down to the basement as it is warmer there than on the first floor, as they do not have any windows yet in the building. It was below freezing many times over the past winter, but they still held

services. They have also put in new stairs to the 3rd floor and this last week poured the concrete for the fourth floor stairs.



This past week they purchased the concrete girders for the 4th and final floor which will be installed this week. They have also ordered the sand, gravel, and 100 bags of concrete to pour the floor once the girders are in place. There is no telling at this time when they will have enough funds to put on the roof and to purchase windows, hopefully before it gets cold again in April. The church family is literally doing all of the work as they feel it cost too much money to hire out the work.

God is truly at work here, we all are standing in amazement of all He is doing.

We told them that when we were in the States, it was prophesied that God was going to do something more than what we could even think of. We all have seen this coming true, with feeding the children, more children and parents coming to the Lord, families coming together. Wow!! And the church being built.

We are very humbled and standing in Awe of Him.

Sunday we had 25 teenagers for Sunday school. The lesson was on why we should know the Bible and how we can keep His words in our hearts and on our mind. Proverbs 4:20-22, "Attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings. Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart; for they are life unto those that find them and health to all their flesh."

Larry and I felt very honored at the Church Service that we were able to help dedicate a newborn baby.

We were able to go to the teenager's fellowship at one of the teenagers home. We met a boy that just came to the Lord through the evangelizing that they do on Wednesday night at the Plaza, it was wonderful to see the fruits. From feeding the children on Sat, some of them with their parents are coming to church now.



What an exciting time we are living in. The Holy Spirit is moving in a powerful way.
