Dear Praying Friends.

I greet you once again from Kenya hoping that you are doing fine in your areas of the harvest field. Kindly allow me to give you some recent updates about the ministry and the country at large.



You all know that I have been updating our H.M.I USA, office over the unrest and post election violence here in Kenya which has claimed over 1,500 lives and displaced over 600,000 families of which some of the families are right now in the refugee camps in Uganda.

Here in Kitale things were a bit calm due to the region being a cosmopolitan city, many tribes are living together here in peace. Most of the surrounding markets here in Kitale were badly affected; houses were reduced to ashes, animal stolen and people killed. Right now our church youths who are working as volunteers with the Kenya Red Cross are attending to so many displaced families camping at the same compound where we rent our church building.

Last Sunday we had a very special church service for the displaced families which was attended by our New member of Parliament Hon Eugene Wamalwa. Hon Wamalwa and I thought that the displaced families here needed someone to give them words of encouragement from the Bible and teach them about God's ways of dealing with anger and resentment because many of the families are so bitter and always thinks of revenge. I preached from 2 Chronicles 7:14 and at the end many came forward and prayed knowing that they should humble themselves, Repent and pray in order for God to take His part by coming down and heal this Country of Kenya.



Pokots are now taking advantage of the political violence and strike everyday, killing people and take animals away. Pokots here are known for cattle rustling and there's nothing that can separate them with Cattle when they decide to drive them away. According to my own opinion, seems like Pokots were there during Jobs affliction because if you can remember very well, Job lost all the cattle that he had. I hope that you can see now the reasons why we seriously wanted to plant a church within the Pokot tribal community. The vision is still there and we trust that God will provide the needed funds to



Start and finish the church project within this tribal community whenever peace is restored in the region. Kindly pray for the mediation talks which are underway between the Government which people claim to be in the office illegitimately and the opposition side. This week the talks are now on some very crucial stages whereby they are discussing the claims that the election

was rigged and thus will decide if Kenya is to move on or crumble as how some prophets of doom have been prophesying!

Finally, our new church choir has succeeded to record their songs on CD and tapes. I am going to send a copy of the CD to HMI office whereby they will produce more copies and send to our praying friends and supporters across the globe for any donations they make through Help Ministries Incorporated for Africa Missions. We would like to let you know that we covet your prayers on our church property because Maureen and I believe that the time has come for us to move from this rental church building. We trust God for provisions so that we may have our own Church building and expand other projects. It would be a great blessing for us to have our own church campus! Thanks for your prayers.
