

SOS Radio Church Report

December, 2008

Dear Friends,

I hope you had a great Christmas time with your church and your family. The month of December for our church, like in every year, was filled with special events. So, I would like to share with you our report about December.

I will report about:

- Women from high security prison who came to perform a puppet show for our Kid's Club
- Ministry in both men and women's prisons
- Special night evangelism meeting on Christmas eve
- Charity event for disabled kids.

This month our church had the opportunity to receive, during the Kid's Club, a team from the women's prison. As you already know, a team from church went several times to the prison to teach the women how to perform a puppet show.



We had the opportunity to see the results of this ministry with our eyes. A team of women came, escorted by police, and performed a couple of puppet shows for our Kid's Club. They were awesome and the kids loved their program. They are also going to state schools and kindergartens to perform the puppet shows. My wife, Cristina, was very amazed about the results. She was one of the church team that taught the women in prison. It was over our expectations!



Also, this month the prison authority and Pater Noster organization invited the church to perform a Christmas program. We had carols, testimonies and a message. We went with a big team from church to prisons, men and women, to bring the good news of Jesus' birth. Our visit was a blessing, knowing that some of the people from prisons are not visited, being left there by their families.

We decided that we needed to benefit during this Christmas and so we organized a Carols Evangelism Night on Christmas eve. We gave invitations to unchristian

people and a lot of them came, being open to the gospel. The church was full of people and it was a great program with carols, drama and a message. We did not stop there because we also went on the streets and to unchristian people to sing carols and to invite them to the church.

As you know, on every Wednesday night we had prayers for people in need. They had sent their prayer requests by the church web site or by phone at the radio station. We have already had some months of doing that and we have experienced great answers to our prayers.



For example, we prayed for a fifteen-year old girl that had a cancerous tumor on her backbone. She tried to be operated on in Austria but it was in vain. The doctors refused the operation because there was such a small chance to live. After a while a team of doctors from Bucharest decided to operate on her. Her family contacted us to pray for her healing. So, we did. Before the operation the doctors repeated her tests and they were amazed about the results. The tumor was gone and it was just a scar in that place. So they decided that they had no reason to operate. After a while she was called to the city of Oradea to complete the test to see if there is or is not any cancer. We prayed again for a full miracle and it came! The doctors said that the cancer was gone.



Another miracle happened last week. We prayed in November for a man that sent a prayer request for his wife. She left him, had gone to Spain and told him that she would never come back to him and to her children. Last week he called us with thanks for prayer, telling us that his wife came home and she wants to be a Christian!

These are just a part of the great answers that we have received. Praised be the Lord! *„You answer us with awesome deeds of righteousness, O God our Savior...”* Psalm 65:5

I will finish by giving you thanks for your involvement in Romania. We pray to the Father to give you a blessed year despite any crisis that will come.
